 - Xavier Institute of Management, Bhubaneshwar (founded in 1987)
 - Xavier Institute of Development and Action Service, Jabalpur (founded in 1995)





Dilemmas and contradictions

- Enlightenment thinking and a neoliberal agenda.
- Religious values and helping less privileged,
- Local context: Indian cultural formations, tribal areas and local political circumstances
- Product of joined initiatives of local and European actors.

These business schools form fascinating spaces where the global is connected to the local, the spiritual to the rational and the elite to the grassroots.





Research question

How are these different epistemologies, values and ideologies being negotiated and reconciled in the making, evolvement and practices of the management institutes in the period 1970 to present?

- Competing ideologies and objectives?
- Funding related to ideological and religious objectives?
- Relations with local actors?
- The role of religion and spirituality in practices?
